



• So... What Are You Thinking?

Thank you to all who participated in the Gallup-Poll Survey that was conducted at all the Masses last weekend. The purpose of the survey is to simply help our Parish Staff measure the various ways that people engage, or perhaps don't engage, with their parish today. The survey also helps to access the overall spiritual health of our faith community.

So far, after our first weekend of conducting the survey, 381 surveys were filled out and returned. Given the fact that we usually get about 550 persons attending Mass on a weekend, I hope we can get about 500 surveys completed so that we can gather input and feedback from all areas of our diverse parish.

This Sunday, there is a table set up in the back of church where you can take the survey before or after Mass. There are 25 simple questions, and it only takes about 5 minutes to answer them. Again, your answers are anonymous. If you have not taken the survey, PLEASE DO. You can also complete the survey by going on-line and punching in www.icsjparish.org/survey into your browser. Again, thank you for your help, support and input as we take the "spiritual pulse" for our parish and plan for the future.

• \$2,557 a Day

Included in today's bulletin is the Annual Financial report that has been prepared for us by our Parish Finance committee. Please take the time to read through it. The reality is that it takes **\$2,557 a day** to run just the parish. Or, another way of looking at it is, that it cost **\$76,710 a month** to run our parish. We try very hard to balance our Operating Budget.

Thank you for your Sunday contributions that directly support our parish ministries. We are all called to be the faithful stewards of all that God has entrusted to us. Please take a few minutes to prayerfully review your financial support to the parish. Maybe you are now in a position to make a contribution, or perhaps to increase your present weekly offering by a few percent?

Note that our Parish School receives no subsidy from the parish. School tuition and fundraising actually covers all of the costs of running the school.

If you have any questions about the finances of our parish, feel free to contact any one of the members of the Parish Finance Committee. They would be glad to sit down and go through the numbers with you.

• Running On Empty

As you can tell from this picture, the shelves in our Parish Food Pantry are almost empty. We are in serious need of donations for the coming winter. Throughout the month of October, as part of Respect Life Month, we are collecting non-perishable items for the poor. You can take a brown grocery bag home with you today from church, and bring your food donations back next weekend. Whatever you can give will make a big difference for those who look to us for help every week.

So, you've heard of Spiritual Direction but are not quite sure what all it entails. What exactly is a Spiritual Director? It is someone who is there to help you notice how God is in the midst of the ordinary experiences of your life journey.



Is it professional counseling? No. Is it a problem-solving practice? No. It's not like fixing anyone or anything. It's more like a wellness practice. Spiritual direction is a one-to-one personal relationship where confidentiality is respected. It is a "safe place" to share without judgement or criticism.

My name is Denise Ryan. I am a wife, a mother, a grandmother as well as a seeker like you. I embarked on the study of spiritual direction/spiritual presence because, like you, I was searching for divine connections within my own life history.

Where are you feeling out of balance? When or where are you most likely to be aware of God's presence? Do feel that God is "missing in action" in your prayer life? We can explore these kinds of questions together through attentive listening and prayerful consideration. I truly believe that the Holy Spirit has guided me into this ministry and God's Spirit is moving throughout spiritual direction.

If these questions resonate with you, perhaps you would benefit from journeying with a Spiritual Director.




The parish budget requires two weeks' worth of collections just to cover our utilities, maintenance, and insurance.
