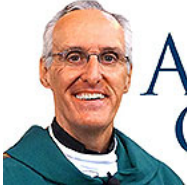

Fr. Larry's Weekly Letter #533

"FAITH-FILLED, LOYAL, AND HUMBLE"



Three words that would easily describe Mike and Angela Baranowski are "faith-filled, loyal, and humble." This is why they were a natural nomination to be the recipients of the 2023 **Christifideles Award** that is presented by the Archdiocese of Chicago. The award is bestowed upon Catholic laypersons in recognition of their generous service.

Mike and Angela have been parishioners of Immaculate Conception and St. Joseph Parish for many years. Even though they live across town in McKinley Park, their connection with ICSJ started back when their son, Joe, entered our grade school when he was little. Mike and Angela had been great supporters of Catholic education. After Joe graduated from ICSJ, he went on to Mt. Carmel high school, and is now currently in his sophomore year at Gonzaga University in Spokane, Washington.

You will typically see Mike and Angela serving as Sacristans on Saturday afternoon at Immaculate Conception Church. They come early to make sure everything is ready before the liturgy begins.

Mike and Angela are super reliable. If you ask them for a favor, they immediately accept the offer without question or hesitation. You can tell that they love to serve. It's in their DNA.

I remember the Saturday that the folks from the Stroke Scan company were with us in the Parish Hall at Immaculate Conception Church. Fr. McBrady was celebrating the 5:00 p.m. Mass and Angela and Mike were just finishing-up taking up the collection. I told them that the Stroke Scan folks would be testing in the Parish Hall until 7:00 p.m. I had to get back to St. Joseph's because I was on for dinner. I asked Mike and Angela if they could stay around for an extra hour after Mass and lock everything up.

They said, "No problem, Fr. Larry. Whatever you need, just let us know. Don't worry, we got it covered."

I wanted to hug them right then and there. They freed me up, and made things so easy for me.

Mike and Angela will receive the **Christifideles Award** this Sunday, October 1st from Cardinal Blasé Cupich at Holy Name Cathedral at 2:30 p.m. We are so happy and proud of them. They have truly been good and faithful servants. We are blessed by all the simple sacrifices that they so willingly offer to support the life of our parish.

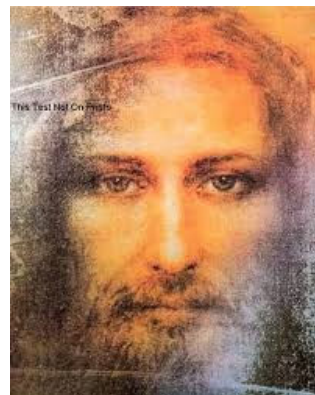

Respect Life Sunday:

Cherish. Defend. Protect.

This weekend begins Respect Life Month in the Catholic Church, with today being Respect Life Sunday. As Catholics, we are called to cherish, defend, and protect those who are most vulnerable, and one way we do that at ICSJ is through our refugee ministry.

ICSJ's refugee ministry is now six years strong. It's a ministry that began with a nudge from parishioner Betty Woodward as a reminder—to those of us who are so comfortable here in our parish, our city, our country—of what it might feel like to have to leave our homes with only what we can carry.

In 2016 the pilot group began meetings to brainstorm how a refugee ministry could be successful at our parish. In January of 2017, they learned of the first family they would be sponsoring, a family of six from Afghanistan, where the father had been an interpreter for our US Military. With that news, the group began seeking funds to help this family upon their arrival—they would need to raise \$8,000. They

calculated that if every family in the parish donated a minimum of \$25, that goal would be reached. Well, every ask was met with a resounding "YES!", and they were blown away with overwhelming generosity, receiving nearly \$20,500!



In March of 2017, after months of training and preparation, our first family was greeted at O'Hare by Father Larry and three of our refugee volunteers, representing all of ICSJ's parishioners. There was palpable gratitude and excitement as this family was welcomed into our family of families.

Due to the outpouring support from the first refugee collection, ICSJ was asked to adopt a second family just months later in June. From that time on, the ball has not

stopped rolling and we have adopted 10 families in six years! That totals over \$73,000 dollars raised for refugee resettlement and assistance.

ICSJ has welcomed families from Afghanistan, Myanmar, Rohingya, Ethiopia, Burundi, Sudan, Syria and most recently this past June, from Yemen. Alongside Catholic Charities and Exodus World Service, ICSJ's refugee volunteers have welcomed and stuck with

these families—they have been stalwarts in helping, advising, and providing them with what they need. There have been baby showers, English lessons, countless playdates, birthdays celebrated, driving lessons, shared meals, gained citizenship,

city outings, and even babies named after volunteer children! Some of our families have been able to move away to establish themselves in other locations, and are thriving, and it is awesome to see how these families have become such wonderful



assets to our country. Thanks to each of you who have made dreams come to life for these families through your generosity.

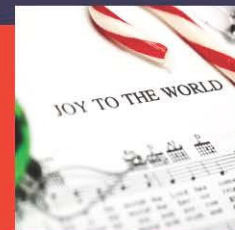

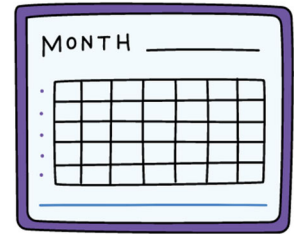

Have you considered a Qualified Charitable Distribution (QCD)?

A QCD gift (a.k.a. IRA charitable rollover) allows individuals age 70½ or older to authorize their IRA administrator to make a direct transfer of funds from their IRA to qualified charities, tax-free. This way of giving does not generate taxable income, which may lower your annual income level. If you are age 72 or older, the amount you transfer may count towards your required minimum distribution.

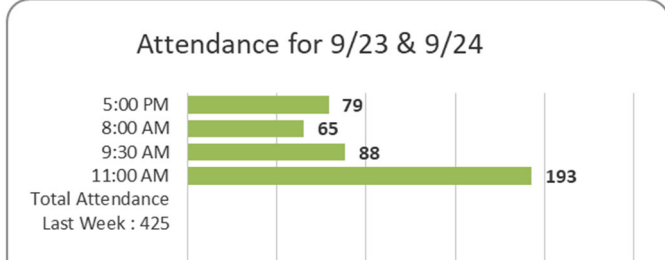
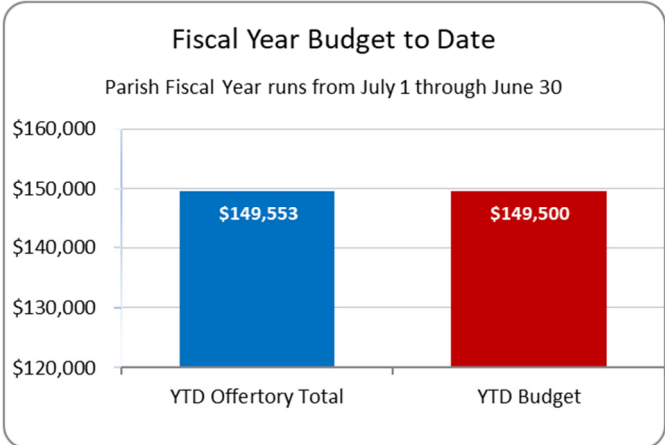
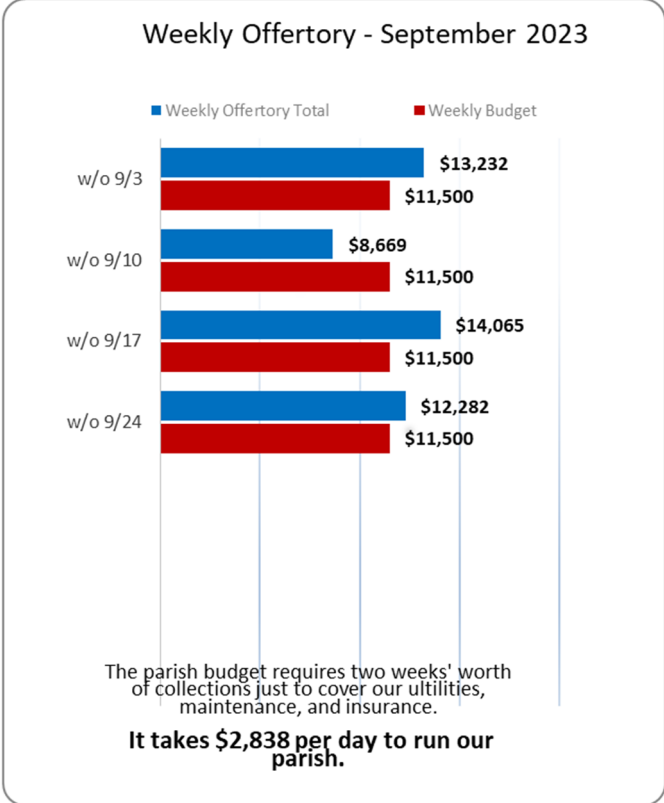

What is a Mass Intention?

Immaculate Conception and St. Joseph parish offers the possibility for you to request that a Mass be celebrated for a particular intention. Requesting a Mass intention means that you are asking that the grace of Christ's sacrifice in his death and resurrection be applied for a particular purpose, for example, for a deceased person or a living person who is ill or in thanksgiving for a favor received. An intention can also be made for an occasion of a birthday, anniversary or special need, or it can be directed to a cause, such as an increase of vocations or respect for life. Usually, a single intention is attached to a given Mass. But it is also possible to gather several intentions in one Mass with exactly the same effect.
