

#### BISHOP KEVIN BIRMINGHAM A GOOD AND FAITHFUL SERVANT

Fr. Larry McBrady and I lost a good friend this past week; and the Church of Chicago lost a good and faithful servant. Bishop Kevin Birmingham passed away in his sleep on Sunday night. His death comes as a huge shock to many. He was only 52 years old.

Kevin was the episcopal vicar for Vicariate VI (and most recently Vicariate IV) for the Archdiocese of Chicago. He was ordained to the priesthood in 1997, and to the episcopacy in 2020.

Kevin was a true shining light for the Church of Chicago. He was greatly loved and respected by many, especially his brother priests.

Kevin was a humble man with a wonderful sense of humor. He never took himself or life too seriously. For many years, he was blessed to serve as a pastor for various Hispanic parishes.

I got to know Kevin when he was assigned to be the personal secretary for Cardinal Blase Cupich. At the time he lived at Holy Name Cathedral. Occasionally, he would help us out at ICSJ with Masses when we were shorthanded. Over the years he concelebrated with us at our Holy Thursday Mass; on Ash Wednesday he distributed ashes to our school children; and he administered the Sacrament of Confirmation to our 8th Graders. It was always a joy and a pleasure to experience his simple but powerful holiness.

One time, when I was out of town, Kevin graciously covered one of our weekday morning Masses for me. When I got back home, I asked the morning Mass crowd, "So, how did things go with Birmingham?"

They said, "He was fantastic! We love him! Make sure you get him again!"

Their high regard for him made me very curious and even suspicious. I wondered if he was giving out free indulgences?

So I asked the morning folks, "So, what did you like about Birmingham?"

They instantly said, "He finished Mass in 15 minutes!"

15 minutes! How he could be so fast?

I then asked, "What did he do... start Mass in the parking lot and finish in church?"

The crowd said, "Well, after he read the gospel, he told us, 'My friends, I got up early in the morning today to look at the scripture readings. I prayed over them, and I even looked at a couple of commentaries about the readings.' Then he paused, smiled, and said, 'I got nothing! So let's just go on with the Mass.'" That was Kevin, humble and honest to the core.

He will be greatly missed. For sure his reward will be great in heaven. Please keep him, his family, and your priests in your prayers this week.


Our hope is that this "Mini-October Mission" will lead all of us to fresh encounters with Jesus, and deepen our faith.






## Why Register at a Parish?

- It is a sign of commitment and support to the life of a parish community and indicates willingness to belong to our parish family.
- Our Parish Staff will have the basic information needed to communicate with individual families, especially in times of emergency.
- Every Catholic needs to have their sacramental information documented. Copies of one's Baptismal, First Communion, Confirmation, and Marriage records are required at various times in our life.
- Families that enroll their children in our Parish School or Religious
  Education Program should be registered and active in the parish, especially if they intend to have their children receive the Sacraments.
- Families are able to receive **important information about the parish** that often comes through direct mailing.
- For **Godparents**, it is required to provide information stating active parish registration, practice of faith and ongoing support to the overall life of the parish.
- \*\*Parish Mailing list is **only used for church purposes** and never shared with businesses or other organizations.








## Have you considered a Qualified Charitable Distribution (QCD)?

A QCD gift (a.k.a. IRA charitable rollover) allows individuals age 70½ or older to authorize their IRA administrator to make a direct transfer of funds from their IRA to qualified charities, tax-free. This way of giving does not generate taxable income, which may lower your annual income level. If you are age 72 or older, the amount you transfer may count towards your required minimum distribution.

## What is a Mass Intention?

Immaculate Conception and St. Joseph parish offers the possibility for you to request that a Mass be celebrated for a particular intention. Requesting a Mass intention means that you are asking that the grace of Christ's sacrifice in his death and resurrection be applied for a particular purpose, for example, for a deceased person or a living person who is ill or in thanksgiving for a favor received. An intention can also be made for an occasion of a birthday, anniversary or special need, or it can be directed to a cause, such as an increase of vocations or respect for life. Usually, a single intention is attached to a given Mass. But it is also possible to gather several intentions in one Mass with exactly the same effect.
