### HOW DO YOU REALLY GET INTO HEAVEN?

There are probably a hundred of heavenly jokes circulating out there about people meeting St. Peter at the pearly gates after they died. For some reason he has been entrusted with the job of deciding who gets in and who does not. To get your name on his clipboard depends on how well you lived your life when you were down here on earth. Basically, the big questions will be: How well did you follow Jesus, and what good did you do for others?

Here's one that you can tell to your family on Christmas Eve.

A priest takes a taxi. They drive fast. They crash and die. The taxi driver meets St. Peter at the gates of heaven.

St. Peter tells the taxi driver, "Welcome to heaven. Here is your golden robe, golden stick, and your mansion is up here on the hill.

The priest meets St. Peter. St. Peter tells him, "Here is a set of old cloth robes, a wooden stick, and your house is way down there in the swamp."

The priest, very dismayed said, "But I dedicated my life to the lost and saving of souls. This is what I get?"

St Peter responded with, "Hey listen, while you were preaching, everyone was sleeping. But when this guy was driving his taxi, boy, did all the prayers start coming in! The end."

The gospel for this Sunday is very sobering because we are presented with a scene of the last judgement. We

hear the classic story of a shepherd who separates the "sheep" from the "goats." The separating of the sheep from the goats would have been a common and frequent task for the shepherds of Jesus' time. Animals were herded together and were separated when it came time for the market and for stocktaking.

The gospel message to us is very straight forward. We too will face judgement. This is certain. It is a simple judgement, not complicated by questionnaires or an extensive survey. Rather, we will be judged by how well we opened our heart to the Lord, and how well we loved our neighbor.

Our judgement depends on how well we live our lives now. Are we on the right side of the line? Do we recognize the presence of Jesus when we feed those who are hungry, give drink to those who are thirsty, welcome the stranger, provide clothing to those who are naked, visit those who are sick and in prison?

Our life is to be a life of service. This is what will determine whether we stand on the right or left hand of the Lord.

Remember, we will be judged by what we are doing now, not on our aspirations or desires. Now is the time to act. Now is the time to put our faith into action.

If we embrace these corporal works of mercy now, then we will have nothing to worry about when we see St. Peter at the gates of heaven. Fear not. Our names will hopefully be on his list, and he will say, "Well done. Come right in!"

### Why Register at a Parish?

- It is a sign of commitment and support to the life of a parish community and indicates willingness to belong to our parish family.
- Our Parish Staff will have the basic information needed to communicate with individual families, especially in times of emergency.
- Every Catholic needs to have their sacramental information documented. Copies of one's Baptismal, First Communion, Confirmation, and Marriage records are required at various times in our life.
- Families that enroll their children in our Parish School or Religious
   Education Program should be registered and active in the parish, especially if they intend to have their children receive the Sacraments.
- Families are able to receive important information about the parish that often comes through direct mailing.
- For Godparents, it is required to provide information stating active parish registration, practice of faith and ongoing support to the overall life of the parish.








# Have you considered a Qualified Charitable Distribution (QCD)?

A QCD gift (a.k.a. IRA charitable rollover) allows individuals age 70½ or older to authorize their IRA administrator to make a direct transfer of funds from their IRA to qualified charities, tax-free. This way of giving does not generate taxable income, which may lower your annual income level. If you are age 72 or older, the amount you transfer may count towards your required minimum distribution.

### What is a Mass Intention?

Immaculate Conception and St. Joseph parish offers the possibility for you to request that a Mass be celebrated for a particular intention. Requesting a Mass intention means that you are asking that the grace of Christ's sacrifice in his death and resurrection be applied for a particular purpose, for example, for a deceased person or a living person who is ill or in thanksgiving for a favor received. An intention can also be made for an occasion of a birthday, anniversary or special need, or it can be directed to a cause, such as an increase of vocations or respect for life. Usually, a single intention is attached to a given Mass. But it is also possible to gather several intentions in one Mass with exactly the same effect.
