Fr. Larry's Weekly Letter #544



"Father, can I buy you a Christmas cigar?"

That's what Teddy Merkle, my friend from childhood, asked me when we stepped into the downtown tobacco shop. The manly aroma wrapped around us like a straitjacket as we approached the main counter.

"Thanks, but I have to pass. I have 3rd Grade confessions today at 1:00 p.m. The kids will know right away if I come in a 'little smokey'."

Teddy smiled and suggested, "Just tell them you had a funeral in the morning, and that you had to incense the casket at the end of Mass."

When we were in grammar school, back in the 70's, Teddy and I were often called out of class by Sister Francine to serve a weekday funeral. We were her "A+ Altar Boys." Even back then I noticed that Teddy loved throwing in a ton of incense in the burner. I thought Teddy was trying to make us disappear in the thick smoke, or that he was trying to get Fr. Ed, our pastor, to turn green. This was the beginning of many bad habits for Teddy.

"It wouldn't be good to lie during Advent," I reminded him.

"Sorry, your right," he said. Then Teddy politely asked the girl behind the counter to slice a V-cut on the tip of the \$20 cigar he picked out. We then sat done in the puffy leather chairs in the small lounge. He gracefully fired up his thick stick.

"So... Father. Let me ask you." Teddy took a deep long drag on his cigar. The end of his cigar flashed brightly like Rudolph's nose. "This year, with Christmas Eve falling on a Sunday, does this mean I have to go to church twice on one day? Do I have to go in the morning for it to count for Sunday, and then again at night for Christmas Eve? Or... are you offering a '2 for 1' deal this year?"

I knew he was serious by the expression on his face.

I said, "Well...I can give you a '2 for 1." Just go to one of the Masses on Christmas Eve, but make sure you put two envelops in the basket."

He silently sucked on his cigar. I could tell he was mulling over my answer, and thinking about how he would explain this to his family. I'm not quite sure this was the dispensation that he was looking for.

I decided to move onto another topic. I asked, "So, how's your Advent been going?"

"Good," he said. "I feel like I have been able to really get into it this year. I purposely made a commitment to slow down a little and try to be more attentive to what's going on around me."

"Has it worked," I asked.

"Yes," he said.

"How so?" I pushed him.

"Well. I really felt the Holy Spirit tugging at my heart this Advent," he said as he flicked his first set of fresh ashes into the clean tray. I sensed that he had something important to share.

"Sunday morning I went to Jewel to get some stuff. As I was entering the store, there was a young family from Venezuela standing outside looking for handouts. There was a mother and father in their mid-20's, and their baby girl who was no more than a year old bundled up in a stroller. At their feet was a simple cardboard sign that they made. It said, 'Please help.' I saw them, but I just walked right past them. I tried not to make eye contact. I just wanted to get in and out of the store."

Teddy paused to take another big puff on his cigar. He continued, "As I was walking through the aisles, I couldn't stop thinking about them. I thought to myself, here you have a young family, standing out in the cold, with hardly anything to their name. I suddenly felt a whole bunch of guilt come over me. I realized, I am here loading my cart with a bunch of stuff for the week, knowing that I'll easily spend probably a couple of hundred bucks with no problem. I also thought about how much money I had in my wallet. I was embarrassed when I remembered I had over \$100 in my pocket. I knew I had to give them something after checking-out."

"Did you?' I asked.

"I slipped them 30 bucks, knowing that it wouldn't phase me at all."

I was glad that Teddy gave more to them than his \$20 cigar. Sometimes a good dose of Catholic guilt is a good motivator.

Teddy continued, "They spoke no English. The father, Emilio, used an App on his phone to help translate my English into his Spanish. We went back and forth for a few minutes. I asked

them if they had a place to live. They said that they were staying at a hotel a few blocks away that was turned into a shelter. They had been in the country since July and have been living day to day since. I felt sorry for them. I realized I have everything I need in my life. I have so much, and here they are with practically nothing."

"That's great that you did that," I affirmed him, but he humbly ignored the compliment.

Teddy went on to say, "When I got home, I could not stop thinking about them. The image of them begging haunted me. I felt I had to do more. So I grabbed three cans of chicken soup. I heated them up nice and hot. I put them into glass jars and went back to the Jewel parking lot. They were surprised when I returned.

I tried to tell them to drink the hot soup right away so that they could stay warm. 'Pronto! Pronto!,' I said. I even included a few gestures from the chicken dance to help them understand that it was chicken soup in the jars.

At first Emilio must have thought I was 'muy loco.' Finally, he started to laugh. I knew then that he got what I was saying.

I tell you Father, when I got home, I felt a whole lot better. This made my Advent. And the best thing is that I never told my family what I did. This was my little secret between me and God. "

Teddy's encounter remined me of the old scripture passage that says that, "God loves a joyful giver."

I bet every Christmas, we all get gifts that we don't really want, or need or can use; like an ugly sweater, another keychain, chocolates from a brand no one has heard of, and maybe a self-help book.

But remember, it's not so much about the gifts we get, it's more about the giver. When giving comes from our heart, it can truly be priceless- like 30 bucks and two jars of hot chicken soup on a cold Sunday.

Don't give until it hurts. Give because it feels good.

I was proud of Teddy, because in his own way, just for a brief moment, he made room in the inn for this family. He saw them as holy people.

May there be plenty of room in our hearts this Christmas!

# Have you considered a Qualified Charitable Distribution (QCD)?

A QCD gift (a.k.a. IRA charitable rollover) allows individuals age 70½ or older to authorize their IRA administrator to make a direct transfer of funds from their IRA to qualified charities, tax-free. This way of giving does not generate taxable income, which may lower your annual income level. If you are age 72 or older, the amount you transfer may count towards your required minimum distribution.

# What is a Mass Intention?

Immaculate Conception and St. Joseph parish offers the possibility for you to request that a Mass be celebrated for a particular intention. Requesting a Mass intention means that you are asking that the grace of Christ's sacrifice in his death and resurrection be applied for a particular purpose, for example, for a deceased person or a living person who is ill or in thanksgiving for a favor received. An intention can also be made for an occasion of a birthday, anniversary or special need, or it can be directed to a cause, such as an increase of vocations or respect for life. Usually, a single intention is attached to a given Mass. But it is also possible to gather several intentions in one Mass with exactly the same effect.
