Fr. Larry's Weekly Letter #546



Christmas was just a few days ago. This Sunday we turn our eyes to the Holy Family of Jesus, Mary and Joseph. We move quickly from baby Jesus who was born in the manger, and now to the temple in Jerusalem where his parents come to present their child to God. For this family, the Jewish laws were important and they kept them as was the custom of the day.

Pope Francis, a couple of years ago, shared this wonderful reflection about the dynamics of families. He writes, "None of us was born magically, with a magic wand. We all have our own story and the family is the story from which we originate. Just like Jesus, we come from a story composed of bonds of love, and the person we are today was born not so much out of the material goods that we make use of, but from the love that we received — the love in the heart of the family.

We may not have been born into an exceptional family, one without problems, but this is our story –everyone must think: this is my story –these are our roots; if we cut them off, life dries off!

God did not make us to be lone rangers, but to walk together. Let us thank him and pray to him for our families. God thinks about us and wants us to be together: grateful, united, capable of preserving our roots. We need to think about this, about our story."

I love that our parish motto boldly states that, "We Are A Family Of Families." This beautifully reflects the diversity of our community, but also the reality that families today come is all shapes and sizes. Your "traditional family structure" has evolved into multiple new versions. No matter what our family might look like, what unites us is that fact that we are all children of God. No one is excluded from God's family. All are welcome, and we need each other!



- 4. Take advantage of tax deductions for this tax year if your gift is made on or before December 31st.
- 5. Gifts of stocks and other securities, held more than one year, are excellent gifts. You may be able to deduct the stocks' fair market value and avoid paying capital gains tax on the appreciation of the stock.
  - 6. Consider gifts from an IRA as a Qualified Charitable Distribution (QCD).
- 7. Gift annuities are an option for parishioners wishing to donate to their parish over a long time frame.
  - **8.** A matching gift donation from your employer is an easy way to multiply your giving. Check to see if they offer this option.



# Have you considered a Qualified Charitable Distribution (QCD)?

A QCD gift (a.k.a. IRA charitable rollover) allows individuals age 70½ or older to authorize their IRA administrator to make a direct transfer of funds from their IRA to qualified charities, tax-free. This way of giving does not generate taxable income, which may lower your annual income level. If you are age 72 or older, the amount you transfer may count towards your required minimum distribution.

# What is a Mass Intention?

Immaculate Conception and St. Joseph parish offers the possibility for you to request that a Mass be celebrated for a particular intention. Requesting a Mass intention means that you are asking that the grace of Christ's sacrifice in his death and resurrection be applied for a particular purpose, for example, for a deceased person or a living person who is ill or in thanksgiving for a favor received. An intention can also be made for an occasion of a birthday, anniversary or special need, or it can be directed to a cause, such as an increase of vocations or respect for life. Usually, a single intention is attached to a given Mass. But it is also possible to gather several intentions in one Mass with exactly the same effect.
