

We enter the sacred season of Lent this Wednesday, February 14th. Ashes will be traced on our foreheads as a sign of our willingness to embrace the traditional disciplines of prayer, fasting and almsgiving. We spiritually center our lives around these actions over the next forty days. We proudly wear a cross made of ashes on our foreheads to remind us that one day we too will share in the resurrection of Jesus Christ.

2-MINUTE HOMIIES DURING LENT

Our Sunday homilies during Lent will be very short. Like last year, Fr. Larry McBrady, Deacon Neil, Deacon Zach, and I will give only 2-minute homilies. Our preaching will be brief, simple and to the point. Our "homiletic commercial" will lead us to a handful of reflection questions for each particular Sunday that everyone will have in their pew. We will have the opportunity to pause and prayerfully enjoy a moment of silence at Mass for meditation and reflection. With the guidance of the Holy Spirt, we will be able to see how the Word of God directly applies to our life.

"LISTEN TO THE LORD, LIVE IN GOD'S LIGHT"

Ash Wednesday and Good Friday are obligatory days of fasting and abstinence for Catholics. In addition, Fridays during Lent are obligatory days of abstinence.

For members of the Latin Catholic Church, the norms on fasting are obligatory from age 18 until age 59. When fasting, a person is permitted to eat one full meal, as well as two smaller meals that together are not equal to a full meal. The norms concerning abstinence from meat are binding upon members of the Latin Catholic Church from age 14 onwards.

Our parish has a reputation for making the whole wedding process a meaningful and positive experience for the bride, groom, and their family.



Have you considered a Qualified Charitable Distribution (QCD)?

A QCD gift (a.k.a. IRA charitable rollover) allows individuals age 70½ or older to authorize their IRA administrator to make a direct transfer of funds from their IRA to qualified charities, tax-free. This way of giving does not generate taxable income, which may lower your annual income level. If you are age 72 or older, the amount you transfer may count towards your required minimum distribution.

What is a Mass Intention?

Immaculate Conception and St. Joseph parish offers the possibility for you to request that a Mass be celebrated for a particular intention. Requesting a Mass intention means that you are asking that the grace of Christ's sacrifice in his death and resurrection be applied for a particular purpose, for example, for a deceased person or a living person who is ill or in thanksgiving for a favor received. An intention can also be made for an occasion of a birthday, anniversary or special need, or it can be directed to a cause, such as an increase of vocations or respect for life. Usually, a single intention is attached to a given Mass. But it is also possible to gather several intentions in one Mass with exactly the same effect.
