


February 4, 2024 | Fifth Sunday in Ordinary Time



2024 ANNUAL CATHOLIC APPEAL



Families in our parish should have received information about the 2024 Annual Catholic Appeal. Please spend some time reflecting on all the great blessings of the Catholic Appeal that come from the generous response of our parishioners who are committed to supporting the good work of the Catholic Church.

Remember that the Annual Catholic Appeal is different than the usual one-time special collection on a Sunday. Together, we are asked to pledge a gift for the year, over and above our Sunday contributions. This commitment can be paid in installments over a span of time. The Annual Catholic Appeal enables us to support our life together at the Lord's table. The Appeal shares resources with struggling parish communities, Catholic schools and religious education programs. The Appeal enables us to support ministry formation, including priest development. It also funds initiatives for justice, peace and respect for life.

Also, through Catholic Relief Services, the Appeal serves people around the world, regardless of religious affiliation, whose lives are devastated by natural disasters, illness, wars and famine.

The Catholic faith is certainly alive in parishes and schools, soup kitchens and counseling centers, on street corners and in churches. It's lived through people of all backgrounds, from every neighborhood. People everywhere come together to support one another. It is in this spirit that the Catholic Appeal exists: to give us the opportunity to share our blessings and gifts, and build strong communities through our faith and generosity.

The Catholic Appeal is also a "win-win" situation for our diocesan parishes. Once our parish reaches its 2024 set parish goal of **\$55,001** in paid pledges, any additional funds come directly back to our parish to help pay our operating bills and salaries. In a few weeks, our parish is expected to receive **\$125,000** as a rebate from the 2023 Annual Catholic Appeal. This money goes directly into our parish bank account. This is a huge source of added income that helped to balance our Parish Operating Budget, and keep us "running in the black."

If you already received your pledge card in the mail, please complete it and mail it back, or bring it to Mass next weekend. The readings on this Fifth Sunday of Ordinary Time give us great examples of the attributes of optimism and hope. Why Register at a Parish?


- It is a sign of commitment and support to the life of a parish community and indicates willingness to belong to our parish family.
- Our Parish Staff will have the basic information needed to **communicate** with individual families, especially in times of emergency.
- Every Catholic needs to have their sacramental information documented. Copies of one's Baptismal, First Communion, Confirmation, and Marriage records are required at various times in our life.
- Families that enroll their children in our Parish School or Religious
 Education Program should be registered and active in the parish, especially if they intend to have their children receive the Sacraments.
- Families are able to receive **important information about the parish** that often comes through direct mailing.
- For **Godparents**, it is required to provide information stating active parish registration, practice of faith and ongoing support to the overall life of the parish.
- **Parish Mailing list is **only used for church purposes** and never shared with businesses or other organizations.

He has been employed consistently since their arrival, the mother has beautifully managed the family, and the children have been model students and great athletes at their schools.








Have you considered a Qualified Charitable Distribution (QCD)?

A QCD gift (a.k.a. IRA charitable rollover) allows individuals age 70½ or older to authorize their IRA administrator to make a direct transfer of funds from their IRA to qualified charities, tax-free. This way of giving does not generate taxable income, which may lower your annual income level. If you are age 72 or older, the amount you transfer may count towards your required minimum distribution.

What is a Mass Intention?

Immaculate Conception and St. Joseph parish offers the possibility for you to request that a Mass be celebrated for a particular intention. Requesting a Mass intention means that you are asking that the grace of Christ's sacrifice in his death and resurrection be applied for a particular purpose, for example, for a deceased person or a living person who is ill or in thanksgiving for a favor received. An intention can also be made for an occasion of a birthday, anniversary or special need, or it can be directed to a cause, such as an increase of vocations or respect for life. Usually, a single intention is attached to a given Mass. But it is also possible to gather several intentions in one Mass with exactly the same effect.
