Fr. Larry's Weekly Letter #528

"SO... HOW DID WE DO?"



Back in March of this year, throughout all of Lent, our parishioners were invited to take the Disciple Maker Index (DMI) survey that was being conducted by the Archdiocese of Chicago. The DMI survey was being offered to every parish so that they could obtain a clear sense of how they are doing.

Some of the biggest questions asked in the survey were these:

#### Does your parish help you to develop a personal prayer life that connects you to God?

#### Would you recommend your parish to a friend?

Would you recommend your pastor to a friend?

# Does your parish help you to grow spiritually as a Catholic?

I will be speaking at all the Masses this weekend about our survey results. We have plenty to celebrate, yet, there are also more opportunities for growth and improvement. Our Parish Staff, Parish Council and Senior Leadership Team will use this information to help plan and shape our future. #### "DON'T YOU KNOW WHO I AM?"

I enjoyed my time away last week and grateful for the opportunity to be on retreat at the Jesuit Retreat House in Gloucester, Massachusetts. The eight days of silence, prayer and reflection was truly a blessing and good medicine for my soul.

I would meet with a spiritual director each morning for a brief "check-in" just to see how the Holy Spirit was guiding me, and to share the things that I was I being attentive to in the midst of the silence.

One morning we reflected upon the virtue of humility and the grace of gratitude. There is a sacred synergy between them. It's hard for one to be grateful if they do not have a humble heart.

Then my spiritual director told me this true story. There was a crowded United flight that was cancelled in Denver, Colorado. A single agent stationed at the counter was rebooking a long line of inconvenienced travelers. Suddenly, an angry passenger pushed his way up to the front desk. He slapped his ticket on the counter and said, "I HAVE to be on this flight, and it has to be FIRST CLASS."

The agent replied, "I am sorry, sir, I'll be happy to help you, but I have to help these people first, and I am sure we can work something out."

The passenger was unimpressed. He asked loudly, so that the passengers behind him could hear, **"DO YOU HAVE ANY IDEA WHO I AM?"** 

Without hesitating, the agent smiled and grabbed her public address microphone: "May I have your attention please," she began, her voice was heard clearly through the terminal. "We have a passenger here at Gate 14, WHO DOES NOT KNOW WHO HE IS. If anyone can help him find his identity, please come to Gate 14. Thank you."

In the gospel for this weekend, it seems like Jesus is taking a public opinion poll. He wants to know what the crowds are saying about him. (It's like he is conducting his own DMI survey). He wants to get a sense of what the word on the street is about him.

But then he goes on to ask a bigger and more important question to his disciples. It is a question that makes all the difference – one more personal: **"Who do you say that I am?"** 

This same question makes all the difference for us as well. Who do you say that Jesus is?

Find some time today to take this question into prayer. Ask God to reveal Jesus more deeply to you and to convince you more powerfully that Jesus is your Savior.

Tell Jesus who you say that he is. Do not be afraid to let him know. If you felt his presence during a trouble time, praise him for being your friend and guide. If you experience the relief and joy of forgiveness, thank him for being a merciful and compassionate Savior. If he helped you through a grueling period of discernment, thank him for being a Shepherd. If you catch a glimpse of his glory, worship him with wonder and awe as the Son of God.

Who we say Jesus is, changes everything. So who is he for you?

Every few years the Archdiocese of Chicago conducts a survey (Disciple Maker Index) that provides individual

Disciple Maker Index parishes with insight on how they are doing, where parishioners are on their spiritual journey, as well as the parish's effectiveness in supporting them. Over a third (36%) of you who regularly attend mass completed the survey. Thank you! Your voices have provided important feedback that will inform and shape our parish's future planning and development. A deep dive into the data

# Have you considered a Qualified Charitable Distribution (QCD)?

A QCD gift (a.k.a. IRA charitable rollover) allows individuals age 70½ or older to authorize their IRA administrator to make a direct transfer of funds from their IRA to qualified charities, tax-free. This way of giving does not generate taxable income, which may lower your annual income level. If you are age 72 or older, the amount you transfer may count towards your required minimum distribution.

# What is a Mass Intention?

Immaculate Conception and St. Joseph parish offers the possibility for you to request that a Mass be celebrated for a particular intention. Requesting a Mass intention means that you are asking that the grace of Christ's sacrifice in his death and resurrection be applied for a particular purpose, for example, for a deceased person or a living person who is ill or in thanksgiving for a favor received. An intention can also be made for an occasion of a birthday, anniversary or special need, or it can be directed to a cause, such as an increase of vocations or respect for life. Usually, a single intention is attached to a given Mass. But it is also possible to gather several intentions in one Mass with exactly the same effect.
