

Fr. Larry's Weekly Letter #529

"LET US PRAY..."

On Wednesday morning, our entire school community gathered at St. Joseph's church for the celebration of our "Opening School Mass" with our faculty and students. As the children came into church, I automatically noticed that many of them got a lot taller and tanner over the summer. I could also tell from my conversations with them that they are happy to be back in school with their friends.



It is always a great experience to have our students from our North Park campus walk over and join the students from our Hill Street campus for Mass. A moment like this reminds me that we are one parish that is made up of a "Family of Families."

At Mass, we also welcomed to our community, our new students and new faculty members. We prayed for the Holy Spirit to bless and guide us throughout the new school year with the gifts of wisdom, peace and grace.



One of the best things about a Catholic education is our ability to incorporate prayer into our everyday life. Our students at the Hill Street campus (4th Grade and older) attend Mass every week. Our younger students at our North Park campus attend Mass about twice a month at Immaculate Conception Church.

The Eucharist that our children receive at a School Mass, and also on Sundays with their parents, strengthens their faith and affirms the Catholic education that they are receiving in their religion class.

When you think about it, this is the biggest ministry in our parish.

IF YOU WANT IT... YOU REALLY HAVE TO WORK FOR IT



One of the jobs that I had during high school was working at the Keystone Pharmacy as a stock boy. This old "mom and pop" store was located on the north side of Chicago, near Milwaukee Avenue and Pulaski Avenue. This was long before Walgreens, CVS and Amazon got big and popular.

I was just 16 years old, making about \$2.75 an hour. I can still remember marking the Pampers diaper boxes with a "\$2.99" sales tag before refilling the empty shelves. Yes, that's how old I am.

When I got my driver's license, the store owners where brave enough to let me deliver prescriptions to the elderly who were homebound. It was a great learning experience on how to develop good people skills, and how to dodge a big hungry German shepherd who was growling at the front door and licking his chops.

One of the best things that my parents did for me growing up was instilling a good work-ethic in me. At an early age I knew what it truly took to earn a buck. Even though I was privileged to grow up in a middle-class family, there were few freebies that came my way. My parents taught me that if you want something, you can certainly have it... you just have to figure out how you are going to make it happen... which meant, just work for it!

This early life lesson gave me a great appreciation for those who labor, especially those who perform everyday, menial tasks. I have a great respect for them.

This weekend our nation celebrates the Labor Day holiday. Our Catholic Social Teachings reinforce and clarify the role and dignity of work, and the rights of workers. All people must be recognized for their inherent dignity and gifts regardless of the color of their skin, their religious beliefs, their place of origin, or orientation. All

our God-given gifts need to be shared in order to build up the whole, in keeping with God's plan for all of humanity.

Our Catholic Social Teachings say: "Work is more than a way to make a living; it's a form of continuing participation in God's creation. If the dignity of work is to be protected, then the basic rights of workers must be respected- the right to productive work, to decent and fair wages, to private property, and to economic initiatives. Workers must always be respected and valued."

Let us take a good look at the work we do every day and appreciate the value in it. May we see, all that we do, as an expression of using our God-given talents and skills as part of God's plan, and as way of transforming the world.

Let us also hold in our prayer those who are unemployed and struggling to find work. May they know our support in their time of difficulty.

WANT TO SHARE WHAT REALLY MATTERS?

It is amazing how many ways we can share information about ourself with others through social media. We can post our vacation pictures on Facebook so that our family and friends can enjoy the places we're able to visit. We can tweet to others to let them know if we are having a good or bad day. If we are really bored, we can grab our phone and text our friends in seconds to connect with them. It seems that even if we spit or sneeze there is a chance that it might end up in a Tik Tok video.

But, how much of the stuff that is posted on social media is about what really matters? Do we live in a culture where we feel safe sharing our thoughts and feelings on a deeper level? Are we reluctant to do this nowadays because it might come back to hurt or embarrass us?

One of the best benefits of our Alpha program is that you can enter into a safe and neutral space where you will not be judged. You can have a healthy conversation with others about what really matters in your life.

Our next Alpha program begins this month. Sessions will be held on Thursday nights, starting September 7th at Immaculate Conception Church, from 6:30 p.m. to 8:15 p.m.



Have you considered a Qualified Charitable Distribution (QCD)?

A QCD gift (a.k.a. IRA charitable rollover) allows individuals age 70½ or older to authorize their IRA administrator to make a direct transfer of funds from their IRA to qualified charities, tax-free. This way of giving does not generate taxable income, which may lower your annual income level. If you are age 72 or older, the amount you transfer may count towards your required minimum distribution.

What is a Mass Intention?

Immaculate Conception and St. Joseph parish offers the possibility for you to request that a Mass be celebrated for a particular intention. Requesting a Mass intention means that you are asking that the grace of Christ's sacrifice in his death and resurrection be applied for a particular purpose, for example, for a deceased person or a living person who is ill or in thanksgiving for a favor received. An intention can also be made for an occasion of a birthday, anniversary or special need, or it can be directed to a cause, such as an increase of vocations or respect for life. Usually, a single intention is attached to a given Mass. But it is also possible to gather several intentions in one Mass with exactly the same effect.
